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the first book to use the catholic theological tradition to explore the importance of free time the fullness of free time addresses a crucial topic in the ethics of everyday life providing a useful framework for scholars and students of moral theology and philosophy as well as anyone hoping to make their free time more meaningful

the book brings together diverse views from around the world and provides a comprehensive overview of academic integrity and how to create the ethical academy at the same time the handbook does not shy away from some of the vigorous debates in the field such as the causes of academic integrity breaches there has been an explosion of interest in academic integrity in the last 20 30 years new technologies that have made it easier than ever for students to cut and paste coupled with global media scandals of high profile researchers behaving badly have resulted in the perception that plagiarism is on the rise this in combination with the massification and commercialisation of higher education has resulted in a burgeoning interest in the importance of academic integrity how to safeguard it and how to address breaches appropriately what may have seemed like a relatively easy topic to address students copying sources without attribution has in fact turned out to be a complex interdisciplinary field of research requiring contributions from linguists psychologists social scientists anthropologists teaching and learning specialists mathematicians accountants medical doctors lawyers and philosophers to name just a few because of this broad interest and input this handbook serves as the single authoritative reference work which brings together the vast growing interdisciplinary and at times contradictory body of literature for both established researchers practitioners and those new to the field this handbook provides a one stop shop as well as a launching pad for new explorations and discussions

inspired by geopolitics and culture this volume studies the link between geopolitical narratives global and regional hierarchies and popular cultural production in the eastern european context

this trailblazing book gives practical examples from the global north and global south on communities alleviating conflict and enabling transformation in divided societies

this book explores the social participation identification and transnational practices of somalis living in finland and the united states through a multifaceted collection of chapters which are based on data ranging from legislation and policy documents to welfare indicators and interviews this book explores how somali migrants experience and explore their identities and belongings and how they strive for participation as diaspora citizens of their sending and receiving societies the case studies are conducted in two countries that differ greatly in terms of their social system migration history and integration policies and as such they provide an opportunity to explore how different social political and legal orders influence the life courses and wellbeing of migrant populations

furthermore the book highlights how the fate of the somalis as a global diaspora is routinely intertwined with the changes in the global political climate and the state level political processes reflecting it this book will be of great interest to researchers students and lecturers of migration and diaspora as well as individuals working with somali migrants

this book examines warren a suburb of detroit michigan as a shrinking city facing a crisis of economic downturn automotive restructuring high unemployment and real estate foreclosures the author explores warren s attempt to develop planning strategies culturally based initiatives community design projects and creative partnerships in the region in order to address the challenges of shrinkage and foreclosures at multiple scales global urban development is currently characterized by varied combination of metropolitan growth and urban core shrinkage while much of the shrinkage is concentrated in central cities first suburbs are now facing the same problem the warren case illustrates opportunities for flexible policies combining rightsizing shared maintenance and incremental development in struggling first suburban communities which are less studied and often ignored

psychological educational gerontological marketing and other literatures all report recent research in everyday problem solving yet few sources have made these various types of results available in one state of the art volume everyday problem solving makes accessible many of these points of view for all readers coordinates them and provides directions from which to formulate new studies the wide but methodical scope of this work will interest researchers clinicians philosophers marketing specialists administrators artificial intelligence scientists educators guidance counselors and psychologists undergraduate and graduate students in these fields will also find this an invaluable source the collection of reports includes an examination of models from information processing theory and postformal cognitive developmental theory and an overview of the tasks used in everyday problem solving research several leading theories including sinnott s are applied to describe the thoughts and emotions of adults as they solve illstructured problems reports on applied research include techniques of master teachers the ways adults resolve conflicts consumer behavior academic intelligence the connection of memory to problem solving intervention strategies and the elderly

do children have a theory of mind if they do at what age is it acquired what is the content of the theory and how does it differ from that of adults the child s theory of mind integrates the diverse strands of this rapidly expanding field of study it charts children s knowledge about a fundamental topic the mind and characterizes that developing knowledge as a coherent commonsense theory

strongly advancing the understanding of everyday theories as well as the commonsense theory of mind wellman presents evidence that children as young as age three do possess a commonsense theory of mind that they grasp the distinction between mental constructs and physical entities and that they have an understanding of the relationship between individuals mental states and their overt actions he delves in detail into questions about the nature of adults commonsense theories of mind and about the nature of commonsense theories wellman then examines the content of the three year old s theory of mind the nature of children s notions of mind before age three the changes in the theory during subsequent development from ages three to six and the young child s conception of mind in comparison with those of older children and adults henry m wellman is a professor in the department of psychology and the center for human growth and development at the university of michigan at ann arbor
