before discovering native healing methods herb nabigon could not imagine a life without alcohol his

powerful autobiography the hollow tree tells the story of his struggle to overcome addiction with the help of the spiritual teachings and brotherly love of his elders nabigon had spent much of his life wrestling with self destructive impulses feelings of inferiority and resentment and alcohol abuse when eddie bellerose an elder introduced him to the ancient cree teachings with the help of healing methods drawn from the four sacred directions the refuge and revitalization offered by the sweat lodge and native cultural practices such as the use of the pipe nabigon was able to find sobriety the hollow tree is one person s testament to the power of indigenous culture to heal herb nabigon s healing journey guided him to a life of kindness honesty courage and humility

this book presents a strong case for the christian faith by using scientific evidence and philosophical reasoning although an abundance of christian apologetic textbooks exist most are not easily accessible because they offer long and scholarly treatments of subject matter that may not appeal to lay readers this book differs in two ways first it presents the case for christianity in a friendly scholarly prose which enables readers to plainly understand each reason to believe second these reasons are concisely structured so that within minutes readers can quickly examine each argument in light of the evidence presented 101 good reasons to believe is essential reading for theists who wish to strengthen their faith in god and for nontheists who desire to critically investigate the truth claims of the bible this book includes topics such as astronomical evidence for the existence of god evidence for creation and intelligent design refutation of darwinian evolution the historicity of jesus why there is human suffering if god exists the accuracy of the bible and evidence for heaven and hell the 101 reasons presented make thought provoking and compelling reading for scholars and non scholars alike

kassanoff shows how wharton participated in debates on race class and democratic pluralism at the turn of the twentieth century

this edition is abridged and annotated with updated information a judge from prussia a french texas ranger emigrants from all over the u s their names and stories are mostly now forgotten but were recorded in this 1900 volume by andrew jackson sowell they were mostly young hardy and looking for new opportunities in land they felt was wide open but in fact was inhabited by native americans the lives of these early pioneers is part of the history of the american west the original bound edition of this book ran over 1100 pages and most of that content is here it s the story of an incredibly violent and adventurous time that was lived by the people whose stories you find here sowell talked to them all and created one of the most interesting collections of personal histories of the wild west

was the civil war preordained to last four years or were there reasons why neither side could land a knockout punch from the outset both north and south had anticipated a brief conflict but despite more than 50 bloody battles neither could force a decisive conclusion for most of the war these battles

followed a pattern the victors claimed the field and the vanquished retreated to rest resupply and fight another day some generals began to realize that pursuit to capture or destroy the retreating enemy was needed to end the war not an easy task taking a fresh look at the tactics that characterized many major combat actions in the war this book examines the performance of unsuccessful sometimes insubordinate commanders and credits two generals with eventually seeing the need for organized pursuit
